

Church celebrates centenary

years in Stratford this weekend with a family evening tonight, and a mass, dinner

Mr Kowaleski, who is believed to be the church's oldest parishioner, has attended since he was born in 1908. He recalls his family of 15, his parents and grandmother all piling on to a horse-drawn cart for the trip from Midhirst to Sunday services.

Mr Kowaleski, who now lives at Marire Home in Stratford, still attends Sunday services at the church and will participate in the centenary festivities.
