After 35 years, Chequers is closing down.

The proprietor, Mr S. W. Sadler, said today: "When I took over Chequers 18 years ago, there were four other tearooms like this, but they've all gradually disappeared."

His lease had expired and structural alterations were required under health regulations which could cost about \$600, Mr Sadler said.

About 40 customers eat their midday dinner regularly at Chequers. Some are businessmen, but many are old people who live in one room, or retired business-
