AT the turn of the century Auroa's early pioneers required a piace to foregather, discuss their problems and enjoy some relaxation from their arduous labours of breaking in a new, untamed but fertile countryside, — and so the original Auroa Hall was built, in the shadow of Mount Egmont, at about £100; — which throws into relief the price of progress — (this new Memorial Hall costing about £10,000). In those early days, the roads and bush tracks were mud, and transport, in the main, was bullock drays and horses.

Tonight, just over half a century later, we speed here from all parts of Taranaki on fine macadam roads in our modern stream-lined motor cars unthought of 50 years ago. Gone are the bullock drays and horses. And so 'The March of Time' brings — some sad, some glad,— but all Proud Memories for the Settlers and present residents of this District.
