Before the campaign the district had raised £3000, but because of rising costs it was found that the money was insuffi-

cient for the proposed building.

The campaign was commenced in the Kapuni district, which is an area with-in a radius of about two miles of the Kapuni school. Each princess had an individual com-mittee, and there was a central control-ling committee. Among the various

events held were a boxing tournament, a race meeting and sales of meat and produce.
